FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA) (Buckley Amendment, 20 U.S.C. 1230, 1232g)

ANNUAL NOTICE TO STUDENTS

Faulker State Community College annually informs students of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974. This Act, which the institution fully complies, was designed to protect the privacy of education records, to establish the right of students to inspect and review their education records, and to provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. Also, students have the right to file complaints with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office (FERPA) concerning alleged failures by the institution to comply with the Act.

In accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, students under the age of 21 who commits a violation of drug and alcohol policies and laws will have such violation(s) reported to their parents/guardians.

Local policy explains in detail the procedures to be used by the institution for compliance with the provisions of the Act. Copies of the policy are available to students in the Registrar's Office. The policy is also printed under Students Records Policy in the Student Handbook.

ORIENTATION & REGISTRATION SCHEDULE

REQUIRED NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION POLICY

All new students are required to attend New Student Orientation. Our Orientation Program is designed to acquaint you with campus facilities and services, college policies, and to assist you in your academic environment. You will also learn about general academic requirements and have the opportunity to participate in an academic placement program (ASSET Advisement/Placement Inventory) that will help us in planning your schedule of classes. The ASSET Advisement/Placement Inventory results will not affect or influence student admission or grade point average at Faulkner State. Students can neither pass nor fail the inventory. There is no charge for this service.

While the Placement Inventory is **required of all new students**, there are some exceptions.

Students in the following categories do not have to take the inventory:

- Audit only students
- Transient students
- Students scoring 870 composite on the SAT.
- Students scoring a composite of 18 or above on the ACT who enroll in a System College within three years of high school graduation
- Students who have an associate degree or higher
- Students who transfer degree-credible college-level English or mathematics courses with a grade of “C” or better
- Senior citizens, undeclared, and other non-award seeking majors who are taking classes for avocational reasons only
- Students in certain short certificate programs having no English or mathematics requirements
- Students who have completed required developmental coursework at another Alabama College System institution within the last three years.
- Students who can provide documentation of assessment (COMPASS or ASSET) within the last three years.

ALL DOCUMENTATION TO QUALIFY MUST BE PRESENTED IN WRITING AND APPROVED BY THE ADMISSIONS OFFICE OF FAULKNER STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE PRIOR TO REGISTRATION. (Since your high school transcript may or may not contain your ACT or SAT scores, please mail a copy of your student score report to us.)

ADMISSION TO FAULKNER STATE

We have made our application process as easy and convenient as possible. Faulkner State Community College has an open-door admission policy. Our requirements for admission are: graduation from a regionally accredited high school, graduation from a nonaccredited high school and a minimum ACT composite score of 16 or an SAT composite score of 870, or passed the High School Equivalency test (GED).

If you have previously applied to Faulkner State or if you are a returning student who has not attended in the past two semesters, not including Summer semester, you will need to update your admission application. There are several options for completing an admissions application:

- Apply in person at one of our three campuses: Bay Minette, Fairhope, or Gulf Shores;
- New students may complete their application online at www.faulknerstate.edu under the Admissions page.

ATTENDANCE POLICY (ABSENCES)

Class attendance is regarded as an obligation as well as a privilege. Absences disrupt a student's orderly progress in a course and significantly diminish the quality of group interaction in class. There is also a high correlation between the number of absences and the final grade. Although an occasional absence may be unavoidable, it in no way excuses a student from meeting the requirements of the course. Participation in an institution-sponsored activity is not regarded as an absence. All students are still responsible for preparing all assignments for the next class and for completing work missed. Students should refer to the individual course syllabus for additional information on the College's standard absence policy.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

A student may withdraw from class or college up to the last class day prior to the first scheduled exam of any full semester course by completing an official withdrawal form in either the Records Office or with the Director of the Evening Program in Bay Minette or in the Administration Office on branch campuses. Students who file the appropriate paperwork for withdrawals prior to the deadline will be assigned a grade of "W." A student must attend classes beyond the 60% of the term to earn the full Financial Aid received, if any.

NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY

It is the official policy of the Alabama State Department of Postsecondary Education and Faulkner State Community College that no person in Alabama shall, on the grounds of race, color, disability, gender, religion, creed, national origin, or age, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program, activity, or employment.

Grades of A, B, and C are considered satisfactory. Students should be aware that many colleges and universities will not accept grades of "D" for transfer, and these courses should be repeated before attempting transfer.

A grade of "W" will be assigned to students who officially withdraw from the College or a particular course according to College policy.

A grade of Incomplete "I" will be assigned, at the discretion of the instructor, when all required work for a course is not completed by the end of the semester in which the course is taken. A grade of "I" must be cleared within the first twelve weeks of the next semester. If the grade of "I" is not cleared, a grade of "F" will be assigned.

A grade of "F" will be assigned to any student who does not satisfactorily complete the requirements of a course or who voluntarily discontinues class attendance and does not follow the official withdrawal procedure.

A grade of "IP" may be assigned in developmental courses at the discretion of the Instructor when a student has made a passing grade on course work attempted but has not completed all course work required.

Students may access their grade report by the web at www.faulknerstate.edu and selecting the student login. Students may also access a variety of other student information items, from any computer that has internet access or the terminals located across the three campuses. Official transcripts must be requested in writing from the Registrar's Office.

No credit will be awarded for courses in which the student is not registered and for which all tuition and fees are not paid. All discrepancies in student schedules and registration must be resolved during the term in which they occur or before the first day of class for the next term.

For classes meeting one time per week, refunds are based on each class meeting being counted as one week. All refunds are issued by check at the end of the fourth week of classes.

All College withdrawals must be processed in the Registrar's Office. The fee refunds are computed according to the date the student actually appears and completes the College withdrawal process and not according to his or her last day of attendance.

An administrative fee not to exceed 5% of tuition and other institutional charges or \$100, whichever is smaller, shall be assessed for each withdrawal within the period beginning the first day of class and ending at the end of the third week of class.

Faulkner State Community College complies with federal regulations relative to refund of tuition and other institutional charges for Title IV recipients.

Students who are active members of the Alabama National Guard or reservists who are active duty military and are called to active duty in the time of national crisis shall receive a full tuition refund at the time of withdrawal, if such students are unable to complete the term due to active duty orders or assignment to another location.

POLICY FOR OTHER REFUNDS

Students who do not completely withdraw from the College but drop a class during the regular drop/add period will be refunded the difference in tuition paid and the tuition rate applicable to the reduced number of hours, including fees appropriate to the classes dropped. **There is no refund due to a student who withdraws from a class after the official drop/add period.** If the student owes the College additional tuition and fees as a result of adding classes, the student must pay the additional amount to the Business Office before attending class. Amounts that may be due students by the College as a result of dropping classes will be refunded as applicable after the 2nd week of the term as long as the student account balance is zero. No refunds of any type will be issued if the student has an account balance greater than zero.

In some cases, you may be given a refund if you drop a class that meets on an irregular basis--for example, if you drop a class that meets only one day during the semester. For more information, contact the Business Office. For calculating refunds, a week is defined as seven (7) calendar days. The first official day of classes is indicated on the college calendar as the day that classes begin. This day may not be the first day on which all classes begin.

The above fees are required each semester and are subject to change without notice. In-state fees include \$91.00 per credit hour Tuition, \$9.00 per credit hour Technology Fee, \$9.00 per credit hour Facility Renewal Fee, and \$10.00 per credit hour Facility Usage Fee. Out-of-state fees include \$209.00 per credit hour Tuition, \$9.00 per credit hour Technology Fee, \$9.00 per credit hour Facility Renewal Fee, and \$10.00 per credit hour Facility Usage Fee. In addition to paying the appropriate tuition fee, you may also be required to purchase certain necessary tools and supplies for some courses or programs. Tuition is due prior to the first day of class.

Registration tuition is due by May 18, 2011. Your class schedule will be cancelled if payment is not made in full by the payment deadline.

FSCC accepts cash, checks (US banks only), money orders and credit cards (Discover, Visa, American Express and MasterCard). Returned checks are collected by Faulkner State. If at any point a check is returned against a student's account, all classes and dorms will be cancelled, and the check will be treated as a nonpayment for services. A service charge will also be applied to the student's account. In the event of delinquent student payments, no college credits, transcripts, or diplomas shall be issued or released. A student with a delinquent account shall not be enrolled in subsequent semesters and all accounts will be turned over to collections. The student will be responsible for all associated collection fees.

Faulkner State now offers Direct Deposit for students. Direct Deposit processing provides the College with an option of offering students a fast and efficient method of receiving payments from the College, regardless of the type of payment. Financial Aid disbursements, account credits, and refunds of any type may be processed using the direct deposit feature. The student may submit direct deposit data through the web suite. If the student has an active direct deposit record, a regular check will not be issued for the students. A student may only have one distribution account for direct deposit. It may be a checking account or a savings account.

FINANCIAL AID

Faulkner State Community College is particularly proud of its financial aid and scholarship programs. Faulkner State attempts to provide financial assistance to the maximum number of students possible, through pell grants, campus jobs, and scholarships. Students who need financial aid must have on file in the Financial Aid Office a financial aid application, and a Pell Grant Student Aid Report (PELL) before any award can be made. If a student enrolls in less than 12 hours, the pell grant will be adjusted. All male students must have a signed statement on file of registration compliance with the Selective Service.

Students on financial aid are required to register only for courses in their student degree plan. This ensures the student can meet the satisfactory academic progress for graduation. **Students who have NOT BEEN AWARDED financial aid must be prepared to pay for tuition, fees, and books at the time of registration. APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID EARLY!**

FINANCIAL AID CHECK INFORMATION:

Loan and Pell checks will be available beginning June 1, 2011 after attendance verification is complete.

ATTENDANCE VERIFICATION:

Attendance verification is required for eligibility for certain types of financial aid. Attendance Verification is completed by FSCC instructors during the first week of class.

AMERICAN OPPORTUNITY TAX CREDIT:

Enables taxpayers — you or your parents — to claim a nonrefundable tax credit against your federal income tax. The tax credit covers 100 percent of the first \$1,000 of tuition and fees, and 50 percent of the second \$1,000 during your first two years of postsecondary education (total of \$1,500).

Federal Family Loan Program (FFEL)

DIRECT LOANS:

Provides financial assistance through Federal Loans. The Federal Direct Loan Programs are made of two types: Subsidized and Unsubsidized.

SUBSIDIZED DIRECT LOAN:

The student borrower is required to demonstrate a financial need. The interest and payments are deferred while the student is in school and for six months after the student ceases to be enrolled at least half-time.

UNSUBSIDIZED DIRECT LOAN:

The student borrower is not required to demonstrate a financial need to qualify for the unsubsidized loan. However, repayment begins immediately upon disbursement or payment may be delayed. If repayment is delayed, the applicable interest payment begins to accrue upon disbursement.

Depending on the student's cost of attendance, a student can borrow from \$3,500 - \$7,500 on both the Subsidized and Unsubsidized Stafford Loan Program for the First Year, and between \$4,500 - \$8,500 for the Second Year. A student can borrow a lesser amount than listed above and is encouraged to do so.

DIRECT LOAN ENTRANCE COUNSELING:

All first time Faulkner State loan students must complete the online entrance counseling by logging on to www.faulknerstate.edu, clicking on financial aid, student loan information and choosing the Stafford entrance counseling link. Follow all instructions to receive your confirmation number.

DIRECT PLUS LOAN (Loan for Parents):

A Plus Loan enables a parent with a good credit history to borrow to pay the educational expenses of each child who is a dependent undergraduate student. Eligibility is not based on income. This loan program is intended to supplement the Federal Direct Loan Program.

A parent may borrow an amount not to exceed the student's estimated cost of attendance minus any financial aid that has been awarded for the enrollment period.

ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT

Faulkner State's counseling and academic advising services are designed to help students achieve their goals. All students are assigned academic advisors who will assist them in course selection, academic and career goals, and other developmental concepts.

UNIVERSITY PARALLEL PROGRAMS

The Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degrees enable students to transfer to four-year colleges with junior standing with all general requirements fulfilled.

Students should consult the catalog of the four-year institution to which they plan to transfer. Variations between the programs required by the four-year college and requirements of Faulkner State may be resolved through conferences with faculty advisors and with the approval of the Dean of Instruction.

TRANSFER/TRANSIENT STUDENTS

Any applicant who has previously attended another college or university will be considered a transfer student and will be required to furnish an official transcript of all work attempted at other institutions before being considered for admission to Faulkner State. Any student currently enrolled in another institution of higher education who wishes to take courses at FSCC that will be transferred back to the original institution may enroll at FSCC upon presentation of a "letter of transiency" listing the courses accepted for transfer and signed by the Dean of the original institution.

ACCELERATED HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT & DUAL ENROLLMENT

A student who has completed the tenth grade, has maintained a "B" average and has a written recommendation from the high school principal may enroll in Faulkner State under the Accelerated High School Student and Dual Enrollment Program. College credit may be earned while still attending high school. This program is an excellent way for a student to get a jump on their college career. All it takes for you to begin your academic career at Faulkner State is to apply. SENIOR ADULT SCHOLARSHIP

Faulkner State currently offers a free tuition scholarship program to area residents who are sixty-years-old or older and who meet admission requirements. A senior Adult Scholarship student will receive free tuition for all college credit courses taken in which space is available.

GED PREPARATION

Designed for individuals age 16 or older who for one reason or another were not able to complete high school. The Baldwin County school system and Faulkner State are cooperatively sponsoring, free to the citizens of our service area, this class to help individuals prepare for the GED test or improve their basic reading, English, mathematics, social studies, science, and essay writing skills. All materials needed for this class are provided free to the students.

Individuals interested in enrolling in the GED Preparation class may contact the Adult Education Office (AE) at Faulkner State at 251-580-2105. The class operates on an open-enrollment basis; consequently, a student may register at any time by simply attending the class and notifying the instructor.

GED tests are administered in Bay Minette and in Fairhope. For further information, call the Bay Minette Campus at 580-2105 or Toll Free 1-800-231-3752.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

SENIOR EARLY RELEASE PROGRAM

High school seniors may be eligible for the Senior Early Release Program if the student: (1) has passed all parts of the Graduation Exam, (2) has at least a 2.0 GPA, and (3) plans to graduate from high school.

Students eligible for this program are allowed to leave the high school campus as early as 11:30 a.m. in order to take college classes at Faulkner State. ECEP

Through the Early College Enrollment Program (ECEP) qualifying high school juniors and seniors earn college credits while completing high school.

All students accepted into Faulkner State's ECEP will receive a scholarship covering all tuition and fees. While the scholarship covers tuition and fees, students will be responsible for purchasing their books and supplies.

The ECEP accommodates students who wish to enroll in courses leading to and/or providing a:

- 1) terminal one-year certificate or two-year career/technical degree,
- 2) college credits for programs in the career/technical fields, or
- 3) credit hours applicable toward a college degree.

ENROLLMENT CRITERIA for ECEP

The following guidelines must be met in order to qualify for admission into ECEP:

- Completed tenth grade
- Passed all sections of the Alabama High School Graduation Exam
- Declared career/technical major in college
- Earned required high school units in courses specified for diploma option
- Have a minimum of a 2.5 grade point average
- ACT/SAT minimum score of 20 on Math and English or placement test score
- ECEP application and FSCC application must be completed

ENROLLMENT CRITERIA FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT

The following guidelines must be met in order to qualify for Dual Enrollment:

- 3.0 or better Grade Point Average
- Written recommendation from the high school principal
- Completed Faulkner State application with official transcript

REGISTER ONLINE

Beginning April 18, students can register online for Summer Semester classes. Enjoy the freedom and flexibility that online registration offers in selecting the class schedule that best suits your needs.

Get started by reviewing your Degree Plan which is accessible from the Interact login. If you are planning to transfer to a four-year college or university you should visit the STARS website to obtain a copy of your STARS agreement. Follow the steps below to register online...

Step 1 - Getting Started

- You can not be on academic probation.
- You can not have any outstanding fees or “holds” on your account.

Step 2 - Get Online

- Go to www.faulknerstate.edu.
- Click on “Student Login” located at the top of the homepage. Then, click on “Interact.”

Step 3 - Login Screen

- Enter your student number (or social security number) as your User ID.
- Enter you PIN. Unless you have made changes, your PIN is your six digit date of birth. Example: May 1, 1983 would be 050183.

Step 4 - Creating Your Schedule

- Once you login, the first thing you should do is check the Academic Term that is listed on the right side of the page. You should change this term to reflect the semester for which you want to register.
- Under “Scheduling” click on the “Registration” option.
- You will see another option to specify an Academic Term so make sure you are registering for the correct term.
- Type the call code number as printed in the FSCC schedule and click ADD/DROP COURSE..
- If you do not know the call code, use the SELECT COURSE link to search the course schedule. Once you find the course you want, click the PUSH button and it will automatically insert the call code for you.
- Click the ADD/DROP COURSE button to add the course to your schedule.
- To view your schedule, scroll to the bottom of the page.
- To drop a course you have added, click the DROP COURSE link to the right of the course.

- Continue the process of dropping and adding until your schedule is complete.
- Once your schedule is complete, click the COMPLETE REGISTRATION button.
- You will see a screen that provides information related to the tuition amounts that you owe. Available financial aid coverage will also be displayed on the screen.
- To complete the entire registration process, you must pay the amount in the CASH DUE column by the due dates published in the FSCC schedule. Failure to do so will cause your schedule to be dropped.
- To save your schedule and pay on campus you can click the I'M FINISHED button and you will be redirected to the Main Menu.
- If you feel that the financial aid amount applied to your account is incorrect, call the FSCC Financial Aid Office in Bay Minette at (251) 580-2151.

Step 5 - Paying Your Tuition

- To pay your tuition online with a credit card click the COMPLETE REGISTRATION & PAY TUITION button.
- You may pay in person during regular business hours on all three campuses, Bay Minette, Fairhope, and Gulf Shores. To ensure complete registration, full payment must be received by the posted payment deadlines.
- If you register during drop&add/late registration, you must pay your tuition at that time. If you do not settle your account at that time, your schedule will be dropped.

Step 6 - Dropping and Adding

- After your tuition has been paid, if you wish to adjust your schedule you will need to click on the ADD/DROP COURSES option from the Main Menu.
- You CANNOT add or drop courses after the add/drop period has ended. If you wish to withdraw from a course you will need to contact the Admissions Office.

INTERNET CLASS REQUIREMENTS

IMPORTANT: Students registering for Internet Classes at Faulkner State are required to complete an Internet Orientation at least one time before being allowed to register for Internet classes. Click on the [eLearning](#) link from the Faulkner State homepage and follow the step-by-step directions for completing the eLearning Orientation. Most Internet classes REQUIRE assignments to be completed with Microsoft Office 2007 or higher (Word, Excel, PowerPoint) UNLESS specific software requirements are noted for each course.

Students are required to login to Blackboard during the first week of classes and make contact with the Instructor. Students are required to follow the course syllabus and outline provided by the Instructor when completing and submitting assignments and tests. Students are required to comply with assignment submission dates as given by their course instructor.

Blackboard/WebCT is Faulkner State's learning management system for delivering Internet classes and providing supplemental instructional information for Web-Enhanced classes. The management system provides online tools that instructors can use to facilitate Internet classes or to enhance classroom courses by using class E-mail, chat, discussion boards, quizzing, etc. Some Internet classes may require on-campus testing, labs, or presentations.

You may login to Blackboard/WebCT ONLY if you are enrolled in an Internet or Web-Enhanced class AND have paid your tuition and fees via cash, check, credit card, or financial aid. Once you are completely registered, you will be able to login to Blackboard/WebCT by the FIRST day of classes OR once your financial obligation has been met. Once your financial obligation has been met you must allow 24 to 48 hours before your course(s) will be available. Click on the eLearning link from the Faulkner State homepage (www.faulknerstate.edu) for accessing Blackboard/WebCT. Review the eLearning Orientation to determine your User Name and Password for Blackboard/WebCT.

BOOK PURCHASE AND REFUND POLICY

Book Refund Policy:

All sales are final unless the course is dropped during the designated Drop/Add period. The student must bring the sales receipt to the Bookstore within five days of dropping the course to receive a refund. In order to receive a full refund, the textbook must be in the same condition as when purchased. If all requirements are met, a refund voucher will be issued, and the Business Office will mail a check to the address on record within two to four weeks. It is the student's responsibility to keep a current address in the Student Records' Office to ensure timely delivery of the check.

Book Buy-Back Policy:

The College Bookstore conducts a Book Buy-Back during finals at the end of the semester on all three campuses. Books are bought back only if they are on the Buy-Back list. They must be in saleable condition and students must have a current ID card. The Buy-Back list is posted on the web with dates and times approximately two weeks before the end of the semester. A refund voucher will be issued and the Business Office will mail a check to the address on record within two to four weeks. It is the student's responsibility to keep a current address in the Student Records' Office to ensure timely delivery of the check. It is at the discretion of the College Bookstore to purchase used books. Course and/or College withdrawals will be handled through the Book-Buy Back policy.

Select the Student & Advisors STARS Website button. Follow the instructions for viewing and printing your Transfer Guide. Fill out the information and check the requirements for you major at your university. Don’t forget to fill out and sign the Area V page from the university of your choice.

- **Why should you check out STARS?**

You can print a copy of the contract between you and the university that is a guarantee of credit acceptance.



- **Who should check out STARS?**

Anyone who plans to transfer to a public university in the State of Alabama.

- **How often should you check STARS?**

As often as you like, as often as you change your major, and/or as often as you change your mind as to where you wish to transfer.

Keep the copy of every contract for every university in which you are interested.

ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE: An "AA" degree is a program of study in preparation for advanced studies to receive a Bachelor's degree.

ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE DEGREE: An "AS" degree is a program of study in preparation for advanced studies to receive a Bachelor's degree and included pre-professional programs.

ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE DEGREE: An "AAS" degree is a technical program of study.

CATALOG SEMESTER: The catalog containing the program of study under which the student may meet graduation requirements. Students may select any catalog in effect during their academic studies at FSCC. New students are automatically assigned the catalog semester they enter.

CO-REQUISITE: A course that must be taken at the same time as the course for which the co-requisite is required.

CREDIT HOURS: One credit is awarded for each 15 lecture hours of instruction, 30 lab hours, or appropriate combinations of lecture and lab hours. Example: a 3-credit English class meets 45 lecture hours during the semester.

DEAN'S LIST: List of full-time students who have earned a GPA of 3.5 or better in all qualifying classes.

DEVELOPMENTAL COURSES: All classes numbered below 100 are considered developmental and are not considered as transfer credit or graduation credit. Scores on the ASSET test are used in determining placement in these courses.

DROP/ADD: Period of time during which students may make schedule adjustments.

FULL-TIME STUDENTS: A student who takes twelve credit hours or more each Fall and Spring semester is considered full-time and therefore qualified for such entitlement programs as the Pell Grant and VA. Persons taking less than twelve credit hours during any semester are classified as part-time students.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA):

SEMESTER: The average (the number of quality points earned divided by the number of hours taken) of all hours attempted during any one semester.

CUMULATIVE: The average (the number of quality points earned divided by the number of hours taken) of all hours attempted at Faulkner State Community College.

Internet Classes: These classes are taken over the Internet using a course management software system (currently WebCT). Check the front of the schedule for complete listings and requirements.

PARKING: All students and staff are required to have decals which are available from the Dean of Students Office. Students are permitted to park in spaces not identified as STAFF or blue-lined for handicapped persons. Traffic and parking regulations are enforced and penalties are assessed. Fines must be paid in the Business Office in order to enable continued registration and release of transcripts. Complete traffic and parking regulations are found in the College Catalog and the Student Handbook.

PART-TIME STUDENT: A student who takes less than twelve credit hours each Fall and Spring semester is considered part-time.

PREREQUISITE: Requirements that must be met before a class may be taken.

PRESIDENT'S LIST: Full-time students who have earned a GPA of 4.0 on all qualifying courses.

SELF-PACED CLASSES: Self-Paced classes are a student-centered plan designed to make courses more accessible and flexible for students desiring to complete coursework in a nontraditional setting. This program affords students the opportunity to work at their own pace with minimal instructor guidance and maximal technological implementations.

SEMESTER: A semester system divides the school year into fall and spring semesters, plus a summer session.

STARS: State-wide Articulation Agreement. See FSCC Web page.

***WEB-ENHANCED CLASSES:** In these classes, an instructor may use WebCT to electronically post the course syllabus, lecture notes, and alternative assignments. Some classwork on the computer may be required. Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer that meets the criteria listed on page 18. Students may use FSCC computer labs to access and complete course information.

WITHDRAWALS:

CLASS: When a student withdraws from a class, he/she discontinues attending and receives no credit for the course. A student may withdraw from a class up to the last withdrawal day of the semester. An official withdrawal form must be processed in the Registrar's Office or with the Director of the Evening Program in Bay Minette or in the Administration Office on branch campuses. The date by which a withdrawal must occur is printed in the College Catalog and the Schedule of Classes for each semester.

COLLEGE: The procedure for College withdrawal and refund of fees for such withdrawal is found in the College Catalog and the Schedule of Classes for each semester.
